Yet, even with all of these and other great winter activities, the most memorable experience for our kids was the wolf call.

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our students, used to buses and streetlamps who had an experience that they will remember fondly forever.

When we arrived back at school, we quickly dispersed back to our waiting families. All of our students were elated and could not stop talking about the trip. The next week of school we commiserated that we were back in Milwaukee, not enjoying the

wonders of the wilderness or the fabulous food served up there. Even weeks later, we were still discussing it, not only of how great it was but how wonderful it was that our school, The Urban Ecology Center, everyone at Treehaven and all of the chaperones on the trip made it amazing.


Looking Ahead ▶

International Visitors

ast April our great school was ⊿visited by a group of education administrators from the National Curriculum Division of the Ministry of Education and Science of the Republic of Georgia. They were invited to the United States under the auspices of the Department of State's International Visitor Leadership Program to learn about the trends and challenges in special education in elementary and secondary education and the role of nongovernmental organizations in providing educational opportunities to people with disabilities.

Leading the group was Ms. Mariam Chikobava, Head of the National Curriculum Division, who was accompanied by Ms. Ekaterine Dgebuadze, Head of the Inclusive Education Development Division, Ms. Ekaterine Lejava, Deputy Head of the National Curriculum Department, Ms. Tamar Zhghenti, Senior Specialist in the Inclusive Education Development Division, and Ms. Ana Zurabashvili, member of a multidisciplinary team that is working in special education reforms in Georgia. The group had two interpreters, Ms. Marika Lomtatidze and Ms. Nana Zhvania, to facilitate the communication in English.

The same day they were at WI FACETS to learn more about the organization and talk with some parent leaders about their experiences with their children and the American educational system. At the end of the discussion, I realized that all the comments about the wonderful students they had met in the morning were directed at no others than our great kids. Since they did not know that my daughter Isabel was a student at St Coletta their admiration for the school and its extraordinary students was not a social courtesy but authentic appreciation of all the hard work of the teachers, students, and parents.


Five of our friends are moving on and we wish them a bright future full of good choices. We are sad to see them go, however we are excited to welcome new students to the St. Coletta Family.
